At St Edmund's College, we pride ourselves on providing a tailored educational experience for our students. This is obvious in various aspects of school life and school culture. This year the College has developed and written courses that will explicitly teach social emotional skills and wellbeing as well as specific study skills strategies and techniques. The Personal Formation program and the Elevated learning Program are courses designed to engage our boys, develop resilience and coping strategies and enhance their overall academic achievements. They are both carefully mapped and have a scope and sequence that is age appropriate. Another way we attempt to provide a more personalised, or tailored approach to supporting students academically is through the SEC Tutoring Program.

In 2020, Tutoring will be offered Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday afternoons from 3:30pm – 5:00pm in the Cath Durie senior library.

This program is available to all high school and College students from Year 7- Year 12 at no cost to parents, and students can attend as little or as often as they would like.

We have attempted to provide a schedule after school where there is a mix of subject teachers rostered on to assist your son in a variety of subject areas. If your son is struggling in class, needs a little extra support with starting assessment tasks, enjoys problem solving in a peer mentoring context, or needs a place to motivate him to study and complete homework, please extend our invitation to him for after school tutoring.

As the year progresses, we have more and more Y11 and 12 students who volunteer their time to help support the younger students, so this is a great opportunity to develop both academically and expand social networks in a positive and supportive environment.

Please note that the College cannot have non-teaching staff, (tutors who are not staff at the College or associated with the College) conducting tutoring on the school grounds.
